Gospel Reading

John 6, Verses 24-35

²⁴So when the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum looking for Jesus.

²⁵When they found him on the other side of the lake, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?'

²⁶Jesus answered them, 'Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. ²⁷Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal.'

John 6 Verses 35 and 41-51

³⁵Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

⁴¹Then the Jews began to complain about him because he said, 'I am the bread that came down from heaven.'⁴²They were saying, 'Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, "I have come down from heaven"?'⁴³Jesus answered them, 'Do not complain among yourselves.⁴⁴No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me; and I will raise that person up on the last day.⁴⁵It is written in the prophets, "And they shall all be taught by God." Consecration of the Bishop of Bristol

Rt Revd Vivienne Faull was consecrated as the 56th Bishop of Bristol by the Archbishop of Canterbury in a service at St Paul's Cathedral, London on 3rd July. "Now, at long last, I can begin to focus on all that lies ahead in the Diocese of Bristol. I do look forward with great anticipation to all that lies ahead for us, and continue to hold the Diocese in my prayers." Bishop Viv will begin her public ministry in Bristol in the autumn, following her move to the Diocese from York over the summer. There will be a service of welcome at Bristol Cathedral later in the year.
